Dear search committee members:

It is with genuine enthusiasm that I apply for the position of president of Black Hills State University (BHSU). My excitement about this opportunity is rooted in an admiration for the institution's unique history, its commitment to changing lives, and the innovative spirit that permeates the institution. BHSU has had notable success through a wide variety of exceptional academic programs, plentiful opportunities for high-impact experiences, a deeply committed faculty and staff who collaborate closely with students, and meaningful engagement. I apply for this position with an unwavering belief in the power of innovative education and a commitment to leading BHSU with authenticity, compassion, a strong moral compass, tremendous respect for the institution's history, and confidence in a bold and exciting future we face in higher education.

I would bring broad leadership experience to BHSU. I currently serve as Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Lewis-Clark State College (LC State) a leading public regional institution with over 4,000 students that is consistently recognized for excellence in Teacher Education, a variety of Health Science programs, Accounting/Business, Liberal Arts, and Career and Technical Education programs, to name a few. Prior to being named Provost, I served as Dean of for the School of Professional and Graduate Studies, overseeing programs in Teacher Education, Business, and Nursing/Health Sciences. Additionally, I have completed over 12 years' service as the Department Chair of Business and Technology and was appointed to Division Chair overseeing Business & Technology, Health and Human Performance, and Equine Studies programs at The University of Montana Western (UMW). UMW is a regional state institution with a student population of 2,200, who utilize a unique higher education model of block scheduling. Students at UMW take one course at a time, in 4-week sessions, and have a requirement of experiential learning opportunities built into all program's curricula. Along with my leadership roles, I have also been a member of the faculty for over 20 years, holding tenure and full professor status at 2 institutions. I have always held myself to high scholarly, teaching, and service expectations at each of my institutions. I have collaboratively and singularly published 6 books; published numerous articles, given presentations, both selected and invited, all on topics relating to higher education.

In all my positions of responsibility, I work under the guiding principles of teamwork that includes being honest and open, respecting others' opinions, intentional strategic decision-making, and an overly extensive focus on student success. I am highly engaged and goal-driven, even as I help to create a work environment that welcomes humor, teamwork, trust, and open communication. A significant strength I have developed over the years, is how to negotiate in challenging situations with patience and purpose, refine

and continually develop college strengths, and most importantly, how to listen and learn from the internal and external community.

## Innovation and Strategic Planning

I welcome the opportunity to help build on Black Hill State's distinctive mission in response to the increasingly competitive landscape of higher education. BHSU's 4 strategic goals that include: A nurturing student experience, evaluation and development of academic programs, building on a supportive work environment, and evaluating and creating a revised brand identity, specifically align with my own personal skillset, passion, and approach. In my current role, each of these same specific goals have been part of our own development of our current strategic actions. In addition to helping guide the creation and successful implementation of my institutions current strategic plan, I have worked with many strategic planning groups at other institutions to help them refine and create actionable, measurable strategies. Additionally, at all my previous institutions, I have been heavily involved in campus-wide and departmental strategic planning, assessment of programs, and accreditation (both Regional and Professional). I have written, co-written, and supervised self-studies of my own programs and have been involved on campus wide committees. I currently continue to consult with other institutional programs on how to set up their outcome's assessment programs, curriculums, and general accreditation processes, that directly tie into their own strategic plans. Over the years, I have realized the key to a successful strategic plan includes how we fundamentally address the importance of retaining students, realizing it is just as important as recruiting students, all while following our mission.

## Philanthropy and Financial Sustainability

BHSU's continued financial sustainability depends on vigilance, vision, planning, and strategic fundraising. I am a highly experienced skilled budget manager and entrepreneurial fundraiser and have successfully secured external and internal resources in support of strategic priorities. At LC State, my team and I were instrumental in refining our current budget process that includes an annual performance-based budgeting program that utilizes program assessment and pairs it with resource requests. Over the years, I have built a comprehensive knowledge of the fundraising process through close collaborations with Advancement and participation in development workshops, and most recently with current sitting presidents' who are affording me unmatched mentoring opportunities. At the foundation of all my efforts toward financial sustainability is ensuring we follow our institutional mission. Over the last 5 years, I, along with my team have implemented an academic affairs committee that focuses on efforts to reduce spending, raise revenue, and develop a strategic budget to address increasing financial challenges, including a "right sizing" of our programs, course offerings, and external funding opportunities. In 2019 we experienced a state mandated budget reduction of approximately 2 million dollars, and unfortunately as is a common situation with smaller regional institutions, the budget reduction impacted academic affairs the most. Through our team developed budget process, we were able to scale our offerings with little impact to positions or overall budgets

#### Community Engagement

BHSU has built impressive collaborations with other institutions, the State of South Dakota, and region, confirming my own belief that institutions of higher education should be working closely with all constituents to collaboratively solve problems and develop meaningful opportunities. At LC State, our faculty, staff, and students partner with community entities to address REAL local, state, and regional issues. An example of this type of collaboration is our state/region Healthcare committee that was directly created by statewide Provosts to address the (national impact) shortage of healthcare workers. Our institutional team consists, of students, faculty, administrators, healthcare organizations, insurance companies, and representatives from all higher education institutions. Due to this type of collaboration, LC State created a co-enrollment pathway partnership with our community college sisters, as well as seamless advanced degree pathway opportunities with our 4 year/graduate institutions. This model was developed internally for our co-enrollment process and has recently been adopted by our State Board of Education to be used by all institutions when articulating programs.

## Visibility and Brand

There is no doubt Black Hills State University provides a unique blend of academic programs with an indisputable commitment to excellence, student success, and lifelong learning. Every BHSU student, whether an undergraduate or a graduate student is afforded a life-changing education. My goal would be to continue the tradition of raising the visibility of the institution, and be a champion of this exceptional experience locally, regionally, nationally, and globally. I have vast experience in promoting each of the institutions I was fortunate enough to work at. At Lewis-Clark State, for example, I was appointed by the President to evaluate our marketing plan, establish our value proposition, and develop a team to build and implement a new brand image and marketing campaign. Since its inception, the team has created a modern, highly recognizable brand, established program specific value proposition marketing, and reinvigorated our ability to reconnect with alumni, attract donor opportunities, and recruit a more diverse population of students.

### Conclusion

As you can see, my credentials line up well with the requirements of the position description of the next President for Black Hills State University. I am acutely aware that education is changing, and I am also aware of the current trends in Higher Education and that it no longer is attracting students like it did in prior years. The costs (though often misleading) are becoming prohibitive for many individuals. People are looking for shorter routes to degrees/certifications and I believe all institutions are facing these challenges. Programs need to be reviewed often, possibly streamlined or condensed, and packaged so that potential students can complete programs in a timely manner, which will show the return on investment (ROI) benefit of an education. Finally, the global component of education needs to be supported and evaluated. Over the past several years, I have been fortunate to travel the globe working with many different Institutions. These

Institutions range from private, U.S. headquartered to stand alone private schools in a variety of countries. The one common denominator is that education is changing rapidly. The reality is students are choosing the school that is going to give them the best opportunity to find a job, and I believe that institution is Black Hills State University, and I would enjoy the opportunity of helping guide in this process.

One of the great joys of university leadership is the opportunity to participate in all aspects of campus life. I enjoy the intellectual, social, cultural, and athletic offerings available to me as a community member and leader. I also appreciate the opportunity of collaborating with students, faculty, staff, fellow leaders, alumni, community members, and external partners.
