Don't miss out on the health incentives!! Qualified employees may earn up to \$900 to be applied to your HSA or HRA. Please log into the portal at the <u>beneFIT Well-Being Program</u> for additional information.

- Reward #1: Earn \$500 HSA or HRA Contribution. If you and your covered spouse (if applicable) both complete the Biometric Screening <u>and</u> the online Health Assessment prior to March 31, 2023, the primary policy holder is eligible for the \$500 reward. Both you and your covered spouse (if applicable), must create individual accounts at webmdhealth.com/beneFIT for the employee to be eligible for the \$500 reward. At this point there are no longer any on campus health screenings. If you did not participate in one earlier this academic year you must schedule an annual wellness preventative exam with your physician and have them fill out the Physician Form.
- Reward #2: Earn up to \$400 additional HSA or HRA Contribution. Earning 100 points will earn you \$100. The primary policy holder can complete this up to 4 times to earn a maximum of a \$400 reward. The reward is awarded in \$100 increments. All eligible activities are tracked on the beneFIT well-being portal. Your spouse can participate in all activities; however, spouse participation will not earn points towards this employee-only reward.

## SD UNUM LONG TERM CARE INSURANCE

Greetings! Here is a message from our benefits consultant at Risty Benefits who manages the long term care insurnace.

As a state employee, you must enroll in the Supplemental Life with LTC plan (aka "X times your salary' Plan) to be added to the SD Group UNUM LTC Plan (2-Year \$1500/mo.) at no cost to you. It doesn't matter if you choose 1x or 7x your salary in Supplemental Life. Employees can buy-up to as much as \$8000/mo. with 2-Year, 6-year, and Unlimited duration options. The employee, employee's spouse, employee's mother and father, employee's mother-in-law and father in-law, employee's siblings and siblings' spouses, brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law, as well as the employee's adult children and their spouses are ALL eligible to join the group plan without having to be an employee of the state. (Employees outside of their 1<sup>st</sup> 60 days of employment and all family members must be less than 80 years old and must answer some basic and limited underwriting guestions ..."Application Evidence of Insurability"). All employees have a 60-day window from date of hire to buy as much as they choose with ZERO underwriting (Guaranteed Issue with ZERO questions to answer) Whether you quit, terminate, or retire; the benefit carries with you into retirement (1 form that changes payroll deduction to checking account auto-draft is all that is needed). You have 60 days to transfer payment to your personal account, or the benefit terminates. When you "buy-up" you are still credited the amount the state paid for your 2-year \$1500/mo. plan. When you leave employment, you merely add the small amount that the state paid for the 2-year \$1500/mo. plan to your normal payroll-deducted amount.

Once HR has reviewed the evaluation and it is sitting at step 5, the employee and superivsor will meet in a one-on-one meeting to go over the evaluation. After that meeting has taken place, supervisors must push it to the employee to review, make comments if necessary, and "acknowledge" to finish the evaluation process. Once step 6 is finished, the evaluation will be marked as "complete" in the system.
