CLEAN EATING!

I'm sure we've all heard the saying, "you are what you eat!" While this saying has earlier origins, it first emerged in the English-speaking arena in the 1940's when the nutritionist and author, Victor Lindlahr wrote the book, You Are What You Eat: how to win and keep health. Unfortunately, no matter how much we try to deny or ignore this, the scientific evidence that continues to surmount only reinforces this still today. What we feed our bodies also feeds our minds! We now know the powerful connection between food and the brain, food and athletics and even food and sexual performance! We know now how pesticides and heavy metals build up in our bodies and cause adverse effects on our overall physical and mental health.

Let's talk pesticides. Did you know that pesticides such as round up can cause cancer, type 2 diabetes, mellitus and even Parkinson's disease. We know the chemicals we use to clean our homes put us at risk for inhaling and even sometimes unintentionally ingesting these poisons. Eating high sugar diets and diets high in pesticides and chemicals causes an increase in inflammation in our bodies. Inflammation has now been identified as a precursor for increasing risk for cancer and other illnesses.

Now for preservatives. What is it exactly that makes preservatives so harmful? Preservatives and dyes have been linked to increased hyperactivity and other health problems. Did you know the preservative, brominated vegetable oil (BVO) found in citrus flavored soda can cause reproductive and behavioral problems? The preservative BPA, found in plastics has been linked to blood pressure problems, type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and behavioral problems such as attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, anxiety, and depression. Decreasing preservatives and chemicals in your diet will also typically help decrease allergies and obesity.

Clean eating is defined as choosing healthy, whole foods that have no added sugars or artificial colors, flavors, and preservatives. So how does a beginner start a clean eating lifestyle? Just changing a few things in your daily lifestyle can make a significant difference. When you're shopping for food, here are a few helpful tips to know!

• First and foremost, remember to wash your food with cold water and clean off any surface you will be cooking on.

• Vegetable cleaners will not necessarily remove more surface contaminates. Scrubbing them could cause more bruising and thus deterioration will happen faster.

Avoid the Dirty Dozen!

Avoiding foods with pesticides and heavy metals will help improve your overall health from your mind to your organs! These foods are best to buy organic: Strawberries, hot peppers, spinach, kale and collard greens, bell peppers, peaches, pears, nectarines, apples, grapes, cherries, blueberries, green beans.

The Healthy 15!

You do not need to buy these foods organic. The healthy 15 will give you a variety of nutrients that your body needs to stay healthy. The list includes avocados, sweet corn, pineapple, onions, papayas, sweet peas, asparagus, honeydew melon, kiwi, cabbage, mushrooms, mangoes, sweet potatoes, watermelon, and carrots.

Super Foods!

Super foods not only help to improve your health but are great antioxidant foods that help fight off stress and oxidation. These foods include, greens/kale, berries, beans, Onions and garlic, mushrooms, fish, nuts, and seeds.

Changing what you put into your body can have positive changes in cancer and disease prevention increasing your life longevity. Eating healthy food has proven to improve your sleep and focus and reduce stress. Hence, improving your overall mental and physical health!

WORKSHOP: THE UNESSAY - A CREATIVE APPROACH FOR INSPIRING STUDENT PROJECTS

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

The <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> (ACP) is a federal program through the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to help address the rising cost of the internet. It helps ensure that households can afford the broadband they need for work, school, healthcare and more.

Eligible households can receive:

- A discount of \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- A discount of \$30 per month towards internet service
- A one-time discount of \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop, or tablet from participating providers

A household is eligible for the ACP if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, **or** if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Participates in any of the following assistance programs: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Women, Infants & Children (WIC), or Lifeline;
- Participates in any of the following Tribal specific programs: Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based);
- Participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program

FACULTY WORKSHOP: TEACHING WITH AI

Teaching with AI: harnessing emerging tools to improve instruction

Description: If you tried to keep up with public writing about generative artificial intelligence and teaching in higher education, you've probably fallen behind recently. As the technology has become a normal part of the learning environment for college students everywhere, faculty have flooded the web with editorials, guides, and examples of AI-infused teaching. At this point, whether you have watched the arrival of generative AI and large language models with dread or with wide-eyed excitement, you can hardly ignore that these technologies are part of the college experience for many students.

While faculty support around AI at BHSU has largely focused on strategies for managing student use to mitigate learning losses, in this workshop, we are excited to explore generative AI as a teaching aid.
