# **OPEN ENROLLMENT IS NOW OPEN**

Greetings Colleagues!

Open Enrollment is from May 2, 2022 through noon, May 16, 2022. This year Open Enrollment is a passive enrollment, which means that your current elections will continue into FY23 (July 1, 2022). The exception to this is Medical and Dependent Care Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs), which must be re-elected each plan year per IRS guidelines. Additionally, if you opt out of the health plan, you must again re-elect to opt out per state statute else you will be default enrolled in the Washington High Deductible Health plan, with employee only coverage. Now is also a great time to check your Health Savings Account (HSA) contributions and to update your beneficiary information for your life insurance.

To better help you make the best decisions for you and your family, please see the <u>Benefits Guide</u> and/or use the <u>ALEX</u> tool to guide you through your decisions. Attached is a worksheet with your current elections to assist you and your family in making selections before you begin enrollment.

#### SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS

With the approach of warmer weather, it is important to remind BHSU Faculty, Staff and Students to take a moment to review our emergency procedures for severe weather.

In the event of developing weather conditions that could potentially spawn severe weather, the National Weather Service (NWS) will issue either a Severe Thunderstorm or Tornado Watch. A Watch means that atmospheric conditions exist for severe weather to develop. If the NWS upgrades a Watch to a Warning, it means that severe storm conditions exist and that you should seek shelter immediately.

Severe weather advisories will be broadcast via local media and mobile weather apps. If you hear that a Severe Weather Watch has been issued for your general area, you should stay alert to weather conditions and be ready to seek shelter. If a Tornado Warning is issued Civil Defense sirens will be sounded in a non-broken continuous tone that will last up to 3-minutes in duration.

At the sounding of a Severe Weather Warning take cover in a basement, interior room or interior stairwell. If you are located in a public building go to a lower level interior area of the building or an interior stairwell. If outdoors, seek shelter in a ditch or low area on the ground. Avoid positioning yourself near trees, power lines and telephone poles. If you are in a motor vehicle do not attempt to outrun the tornado. Stop, exit the vehicle immediately and seek shelter away from your vehicle.

Tornadoes are somewhat rare in this area but can and do happen here. We all need to be alert to the weather conditions, act quickly when a tornado is detected and remain calm. For campus emergency shelter locations please follow <a href="this link">this link</a>.
