BHSU Mission Statement - Revisited

BHSU is constantly in a state of renewal and reflection. In 2014-15 BHSU revisited the strategic plan, setting out an agenda to continue to manage enrollment and retention, strengthen undergraduate research and faculty mentorship, strengthen accreditations, develop new degrees, and address civic engagement. Since that time many accomplishments have been reached, including three major accreditations: HLC, AACSB, and CAEP.

The campus is now at another crossroads that requires the community to reflect once again on how best to describe the university's mission and vision.

Below is a DRAFT mission statement. It is presented by the University's Strategic Initiatives Committee, which thoughtfully considered and discussed how to present what BHSU does as a university through the mission statement. The members are listed below.

BHSU has essentially three published missions: the legislative version and two university versions that have evolved over the years. This DRAFT is intended to present one university mission (replacing the two existing university versions). The legislative mission shall remain untouched.

Poetry and Divergent Thinking

The Spanish Department at Black Hills State University invites you to join us in "Poetry and Divergent Thinking" presentation, hosted by Dr. Rachid Lamarti from Tamkang University (Taipei), next *Tuesday, April 2, 2019, 3 p.m.* on Club Buzz (lower level at Student Union at BHSU).

Presentation description:

As a rule, art is linked to a producer (the artist) and a product (the work of art). However, the receiver (reader, viewer, etc.) is far (or entirely outside) those coordinates.

The art equation does not take it into account.

However, upon receiving the artistic work, the recipient, to some extent, ends up (re)producing it. By endowing it with meaning, it completes it, that is to say, it realizes it.

Its function in the materialization of art does not go beyond the performance of the artist.

The reader of the poem participates in poetic realization as much as the poet himself. It is not that the poet leaves the poetry half- or unfinished and delegates responsibility for culminating in the reader, but rather, poetry allows the reader to catch glimpses of the poet through his poem.

The reading of the poem will arouse a glimmer in the reader of which will result the same or another poetry.

On the other hand, much of contemporary poetry comes from a use of divergent language.

César Vallejo (A man is looking at a woman, / is looking at her immediately), Oliverio Girondo (between epithelia of dawn or sleepless hangover from growing loneliness), Vicente Huidobro (With your eyes that evoke a piano of smells), etcetera, cultivated the divergence and surprise the reader with his poems.

Nobody, however, can say that they do not write (and very well) in Spanish. The language of these poets starts from subverted conceptual systems, that is to say: divergent. In the non-native production of Spanish-speaking students, a similar result can sometimes be appreciated, if not a similar principle.

The non-native Spanish of these students starts from conceptual systems that are not subverted, certainly, but equally divergent.

This conference, incardinate in the study of creative ways of reading literature, will expose the virtues of poetic reading in class and how poetry can stimulate the oral and written production of all students and in particularly, Spanish students.

Poetry and Divergent Thinking will be of interest to all public to explore how poem can be seen as indicator that generate creativity (in a broad sense) in our students.

In 2014-15 BHSU revisited the strategic plan, setting out an agenda to continue to manage enrollment and retention, strengthen undergraduate research and faculty mentorship, strengthen accreditations, develop new degrees, and address civic engagement. Since that time many accomplishments have been reached, including three major accreditations: HLC, AACSB, and CAEP.

The campus is now at another crossroads that requires the community to reflect once again on how best to describe the university's mission and vision.

BHSU has essentially three published missions: the legislative version and two university versions that have evolved over the years. This DRAFT is intended to present one university mission (replacing the two existing university versions). The legislative mission shall remain untouched.

Are You a Blamer?

Victim blaming is a pervasive part of the trauma many sexual assault survivors experience.

Too often when survivors disclose, they are met with a checklist of questions, all centered on their actions instead of the perpetrator's.

Rather than focusing on the inappropriate and illegal conduct of the perpetrator, many will actually blame the victim.

You can stop victim blaming...whether it's adjusting your own behavior, holding a perpetrator responsible, changing your community's attitude towards victim blaming. Severe Weather Awareness Week

Severe Weather Awareness Week - 2019

April 22-26, 2019 has been designated Severe Weather Awareness Week in South Dakota. With the approach of warmer weather, it is important to remind BHSU Faculty, Staff and Students to take a moment to review our emergency procedures for severe weather.

In the event of developing weather conditions that could potentially spawn severe weather, the National Weather Service will issue either a Severe Thunderstorm Watch or a Tornado Watch. A Watch means that atmospheric conditions exist for severe weather to develop.

If the National Weather Service upgrades a Watch to a Warning, it means that severe storm conditions exist and that you should take shelter immediately.

Severe weather advisories will be broadcast on local radio and television stations. If you hear that a Severe Weather Watch has been issued for your general area, you should stay alert to weather conditions and be ready to seek shelter. If a Tornado Warning is issued civil defense sirens will be sounded in a non-broken continuous tone that will last up to 3-minutes in duration.

At the sounding of a Severe Weather Warning, take cover in a basement or interior room of your home. If you live in a mobile home, leave at once and seek another shelter. If you are located in a public building go to a lower interior area of the building. Use stairways and avoid the use of elevators. If you are outdoors, seek shelter in a ditch or low area on the ground. Avoid positioning yourself near trees, power lines and telephone poles. If you are in a motor vehicle do not attempt to outrun the tornado, stop, exit the vehicle immediately and seek shelter away from your vehicle. For campus emergency shelter locations, see the information below.

Tornadoes are rare in this area but can and do happen here. We all need to be alert to the weather conditions, act quickly when a tornado is detected, and remain calm. You and your family should know in advance what to do if the civil defense warnings are issued.

State-wide Tornado Drills will be conducted on Wednesday April 24, 2019 sometime between 9 a.m. & 9:15 a.m.

Meier Hall - 1st floor away from the doors and any windows.

Woodburn Hall - 1st floor away from the doors or the Library 1st floor.

Library - basement.

Wenona Cook - 1st floor south side corridor, interior doors closed.

Facilities Services - Lower level of building, near an interior wall.

Jonas - basement.

Student Union - 1st floor corridor, or the Jonas basement.

Young Center - Administration Office Area, athletic shower rooms 1st floor, corridor between the shower area and gym - away from exterior doors/glass.

Bordeaux, Heidepriem & Thomas Residence Halls - 1st floors, interior doors closed.

Humbert Residence Hall - 1st floor south, interior doors closed.

Apartments - first floor bathroom tub with mattress over the top of you or the Young Center.

Life Sciences Laboratory - For severe storms, use the main floor restrooms/showers. In the event of an active shooter situation, use the loading dock area northwest corner of the building.

Dr. Trenton Ellis - "Hungry Jackets: Exploring Food Insecurity on Campus"

Food security "means access by all people at all times to enough food for an active, healthy life" (USDA 2019). Most Americans (88 percent) live in food secure households (USDA 2017). People who lack access to enough food are considered food insecure. Nationwide, just under 12 percent of Americans can be categorized as food insecure (USDA 2017). As with most social problems, some groups struggle more than others. As many as 45 percent of U.S. college students exhibit some level of food insecurity (Goldrick Rab et al. 2019). Although extensive research has been conducted in this arena, the research regarding international students, especially the rapidly growing number of Asian students, is still limited. This study utilized a convergent parallel mixed methods design (Creswell) using Kolb Experiential Learning Theory (ELT) to investigate the preferred experiential learning (EL) styles and spaces for international students, notably from China and other Asian countries. The findings provide possible approaches to develop appropriate experiential

learning styles and spaces. The outcome of the study presented below indicates that well-balanced learning styles should be emphasized instead of ranking the priority of learning preferences.

Dr. Andrey Reznikov - "The Forgotten Founding Father: Noah Webster and His Dictionary"

Noah Webster today is mostly known - if known at all - as the compiler of the first American Dictionary of the English Language. Indeed, his dictionary is the most famous, but not his only creation. His spelling book, which sold millions of copies, created new spelling rules - rules we still use today. But that is not all. Even though Webster personally did not take part in writing of the US Constitution, his passionate political speeches and essays in support of the united country, during the time when the United States were anything but united - were a powerful influence in creating the real union of the first 13 states. Thus, he truly is the forgotten founding father - of the new country and its new culture, and his dictionary of American English is a testament to that.

The Legacy of Dislocation: A History of Urban Segregation in Rapid City

Following the closure of the City Indian Boarding School, the U.S. Department of the

Interior (DOI) allowed a 1,200-acre parcel of land to be taken by a number of non-Native public and religious entities. Although the DOI intended that some of this land be given for the use of—in the language of the day—"needy Indians," not a single inch of those 1,200 acres went to Native people. This property covers much of what is today western Rapid City, which also happens to include much of the city's most valuable real estate. Heather Dawn Thompson and Dr. Eric Zimmer's presentation will explore the series of municipal, school district, county, federal decisions, and questionable land swaps which led to the consolidation of Rapid City's Native population into specific neighborhoods that have faced high degrees of socioeconomic disadvantage.

Geek Speak: "A Brief History of Black Holes"

Please join us for this week's Geek Speak: Nov. 14 at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110:

Dr. Parthasarathi Nag - "A Brief History of Black Holes"

With the recent [April, 10th, 2019] observation of a Black Hole in the center of the supergiant elliptical galaxy Messier 87 using an global array of radio X-ray telescopes known by Event Horizon Telescope it might be an appropriate time for briefly reviewing certain aspects of this object in general. Our story will start from the 18th century with mathematician Pierre-Simon Laplace who postulated using Newton's theory of gravity the first idea of a Black Hole. During the early 20th century mathematician David Hilbert and physicist Albert Einstein formulated the General Theory of Relativity. In a few months after the announcement of the result [1915], Karl Schwarzschild obtained a solution [in the middle of a trench during WW-I around 1916] to the Hilbert-Einstein equation which had an interesting aspect to it called "singularity". One of the consequence of this is an extremely warped space-time, so much so that even light cannot escape and we have a Black Hole. However, it was found by Arthur Eddington and Finkelstein that this is an "apparent singularity" and a Black Hole can be characterized along with the idea of a White Hole which could be the nature of Big Bang. These effects are still classical without any quantum effects till physicist Stephen Hawking and Jacob Bekenstein theorized that Black Holes should radiate which ultimately leads to a Black Hole evaporating. Along with this presentation on Black Hole we will also point out how this has influenced certain interesting paradoxes one of which is called the Information Paradox that has resulted into the "Black Hole War" between Stephen Hawking on one side and Gerard 't Hooft/Leonard Susskind on the other side.

Geek Speak: A Brief History of Black Holes

Please join us for this week's Geek Speak: Thursday, November 14 at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110.

Dr. Parthasarathi Nag - "A Brief History of Black Holes"

With the recent [April, 10th, 2019] observation of a Black Hole in the center of the supergiant elliptical galaxy Messier 87 using an global array of radio X-ray telescopes known by Event Horizon Telescope it might be an appropriate time for briefly reviewing certain aspects of this object in general. Our story will start from the 18th century with mathematician Pierre-Simon Laplace who postulated using Newton's theory of gravity the first idea of a Black Hole. During the early 20th century mathematician David Hilbert and physicist Albert Einstein formulated the General Theory of Relativity. In a few months after the announcement of the result [1915], Karl Schwarzschild obtained a solution [in the middle of a trench during WW-I around 1916] to the Hilbert-Einstein equation which had an interesting aspect to it called "singularity". One of the consequence of this is an extremely warped space-time, so much so that even light cannot escape and we have a Black Hole. However, it was found by Arthur Eddington and Finkelstein that this is an "apparent singularity" and a Black Hole can be characterized along with the idea of a White Hole which could be the nature of Big Bang. These effects are still classical without any quantum effects till physicist Stephen Hawking and Jacob Bekenstein theorized that Black Holes should radiate which ultimately leads to a Black Hole evaporating. Along with this presentation on Black Hole we will also point out how this has influenced certain interesting paradoxes one of which is called the Information Paradox that has resulted into the "Black Hole War" between Stephen Hawking on one side and Gerard 't Hooft/Leonard Susskind on the other side.

Ruffalo Noel Levitz Strategic Enrollment Plan development process and working groups

BHSU is taking a number of steps to improve recruitment and retention with a goal of reversing a declining enrollment trend. A first initiative was to immediately address low retention rates that have fluctuated in recent years but have remained lower than our peers. A Retention Task Force was identified and this group has been working diligently to make a set of recommendations on improvements and changes that should be made to enhance retention of first year students (freshman to sophomore).

BHSU has also retained the services of Ruffalo Noel Levitz (RNL), a well-known higher education consulting firm, to create a long-term Strategic Enrollment Plan that will improve enrollment and retention.

There will be four phases to the Strategic Enrollment Plan:

- 1. Preparations and Data Analysis
- 2. Strategy Development
- 3. Goal Development
- 4. Implementation and Continuation

The framework has been established which includes a steering committee, a data team, and five working groups to consider areas of concern and explore possible opportunities.

Our RNL consultant will be back on campus Jan. 22 and 23 with a goal of working with each of the five working groups.

For more details on the RNL process and recommendations, a web page has been established and will be updated as progress continues. Please review the details <u>here</u>. If

you have questions or suggestions, please reach out to the Steering Committee or <u>Working Group leaders</u>. This is a campus wide effort. I'm confident that these initiatives will make a measurable improvement in both recruitment and retention for BHSU.
