Receive your W2 earlier this year with electronic consent!

Thank you to all that have elected to receive tax documents electronically so far, we are so close to our goal this year. Those that have not updated your receipt preferences, THERE'S STILL TIME!

Last year the South Dakota Board of Regents implemented a new electronic process for receiving tax documents. This process provides a secure and efficient method of delivery eliminating delays and errors from the traditional postal system, earlier access to W-2 and 1095-C information, and access to print additional copies at your convenience.

Signing Up is Easy!

- 1. Log-in to your SNAP account.
- 2. Complete the Electronic Statement of Consent located in SNAP under the Employee tab> Employment Details Box>Employee Self Service> Tax Forms>Electronic W2 Consent.
- 3. Read the Electronic Regulatory Consent information and click the box under My Choice>Consent to receive W-2 electronically and Consent to receive 1095-C electronically.
- 4. Click the Submit button.
- 5. Upon successful completion, a green check mark and the statement "Electronic Statement consent was submitted successfully" indicate you're finished. View an example here.

Sustainability Public Service Announcement: Pandemic Plastic

Have you been thinking about how you can protect the environment even during the pandemic?

Because of COVID-19, there has been increased plastic production and use in order to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Restaurants are offering the option for takeout meals in plastic takeout containers with cutlery. We are required to use more PPE (personal protective equipment) such as masks, gloves, face shields, hand sanitizer in plastic bottles and Plexiglass barriers. We would like to challenge you to observe the amount of single-use masks on the ground and being used in public the next time you are on campus or in Spearfish.

We know that a lot of people are switching to throw away items, maybe because they believe using single-use masks and plastic containers and throwing them away is safer rather than risking infection from reusables, but it has been reported that is possible to use reusables and still be safe.

Here are a few tips for helping to reduce the plastic epidemic:

REDUCE the amount of takeout you are getting

REUSE grocery bags and plastic containers as well as use reusable/washable masks

REFILL water containers

REFUSE plastic cutlery that comes in takeout orders and plastic grocery bags at Walmart (bring your own reusable bags)

BUY locally

We encourage folks to take action on the pandemic plastic pollution crisis and to eliminate single-use plastics and switch to a REDUCE, REUSE, REFUSE and REFILL method.

Joshua Adkins Sr., a recent graduate with a BFA in Photography has been accepted into the graduate program at the Royal College of Art in London.

Established in 1837, the Royal College of Art is the world's oldest art and design university in continuous operation, with a tradition of innovation and excellence in creative education. In 2019, the RCA was ranked as the number one Art and Design university in the world - for the fifth consecutive year, by the QS World University Subject Rankings.

The QS World University Rankings compares 950 universities worldwide across different subjects, The RCA is generally regarded by academics in the field as being the world's superior institution for art and design, boasting a score of 100/100 for academic reputation.

It is also among the world's strongest producers of employable graduates, perhaps in recognition of the number of outstanding painters, designers, and Turner Prize winners that leave the RCA, it scores 88.8/100 for employer reputation, leaving it with an overall score of 98.8/100

Joshua and his son will be moving to London over the summer to begin his graduate studies in the Fall of 2021, while his wife and daughter remain in the United States so that she can complete her graduate degree here.

When asked about his acceptance Josh stated, "I would not have had the confidence to apply to the Royal College of Art had it not been for the unwavering support of the faculty at Black Hills State University. NHS is the first Wyoming school to contact the International Space Station. NHS students will be asking questions to Commander Michael Hopkins. This is the result of 17 months of planning efforts by teacher Jim Stith. Jim is a BHSU alumni. University faculty and staff can now be added to waiting list for COVID-19 vaccination

The COVID-19 pandemic is changing rapidly and requires varied strategies to maintain clinical preventive services, including immunization.

University faculty and staff fall within the 1D category for COVID-19 vaccinations. Although vaccines are not yet available for this group, you can get on a waiting list for the vaccination.

Monument Health has updated the process to schedule a COVID-19 vaccination. Access the new website https://vaccineregister.monument.health/ to be placed on a waiting list for the vaccination when it is available for the 1D category. Monument Health is encouraging people to use this web form rather than MyChart or scheduling by phone. Phone calls are still being accepted at 755-1350.

On the web form and by phone, you'll be asked to indicate the location that you'd like to receive your vaccination and your preferred contact information.

When you receive your vaccine depends on the amount available and the identified priority groups as defined by the state. Students fall into Category 2. For details about the groups, visit the SD DOH site: https://doh.sd.gov/COVID/Vaccine/.

BHSU does not have an Instructor or Institutional course drop policy. Students must initiate the process to drop individual courses. An administrative withdrawal may occur if a student is found to, either, not be participating in any of their registered courses and/or have a large unpaid tuition balance that is not being addressed.

The COVID-19 pandemic is changing rapidly and requires varied strategies to maintain clinical preventive services, including immunization.

University faculty and staff fall within the 1D category for COVID-19 vaccinations. Although vaccines are not yet available for this group, you can get on a waiting list for the vaccination.

Monument Health has updated the process to schedule a COVID-19 vaccination. Access the new website https://vaccineregister.monument.health/ to be placed on a waiting list for the vaccination when it is available for the 1D category. Monument Health is encouraging people to use this web form rather than MyChart or scheduling by phone. Phone calls are still being accepted at 755-1350.

On the web form and by phone, you'll be asked to indicate the location that you'd like to receive your vaccination and your preferred contact information.

The availability of vaccines is determined by the priority groups as defined by the state. Students, including those who live on campus, are in Category 2 for vaccinations. For details about the groups, visit the SD DOH site: https://doh.sd.gov/COVID/Vaccine/.

Financial Aid Awareness Month

Throughout the month of February, the higher education community celebrates Financial Aid Awareness Month in an effort to provide crucial information to students and families about access to federal, state, and institutional student aid. BHSU would like to provide some valuable information to our students.

Here are a few things you should know:

- To complete your FAFSA, sign your master promissory note, and more go to https://studentaid.gov.
- FAFSA Early completion starts October 1st of each year. There is no need to delay because you can use your 2020 taxes for the 2022-23 award year that begins July 1, 2021. If you have not already done so, we encourage you to submit your 2021-22 FAFSA as soon as possible. The sooner you complete your FAFSA, the better your opportunity to receive an additional scholarship and/or grant funding.
- If you have questions about student borrowing, NSLDS is a great information website. Here is the link: https://nsldsfap.ed.gov/nslds-SA/
- It is important for you to understand that if you are not meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) that you could lose eligibility of your financial aid. When this happens,

you can file an appeal. However, it is very important to ensure you meet with an academic advisor to complete an Academic Success Plan. You can identify your academic advisor on DegreeWorks or by contacting the Student Success Center.

The COVID-19 pandemic is changing rapidly and requires varied strategies to maintain clinical preventive services, including immunization.

University faculty and staff fall within the 1D category for COVID-19 vaccinations. Although vaccines are not yet available for this group, you can get on a waiting list for the vaccination.

Monument Health has updated the process to schedule a COVID-19 vaccination. Access the new website https://vaccineregister.monument.health/ to be placed on a waiting list for the vaccination when it is available for the 1D category. Monument Health is encouraging people to use this web form rather than MyChart or scheduling by phone. Phone calls are still being accepted at 755-1350.

On the web form and by phone, you'll be asked to indicate the location that you'd like to receive your vaccination and your preferred contact information.

The availability of vaccines is determined by the priority groups as defined by the state. Students, including those who live on campus, are in Category 2 for vaccinations. For details about the groups, visit the SD DOH site: https://doh.sd.gov/COVID/Vaccine/.

The South Dakota Department of Health updated its timeline for the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccination for teachers & college staff. Based on the estimates, educators could be scheduled for their vaccination as early as March 22.

If you haven't signed up on the COVID-19 vaccination waitlist yet, please do so at https://vaccineregister.monument.health/

Please see the following details about scheduling from Monument Health. It's important to remember:

- If you don't answer your phone when we call you to schedule, we will call the next person on the list.
- If you have a spam filter on your phone you might miss our call.
- We will not begin calling to schedule appointments until at least March 15.
- This timeline could change as we continue to move through these vaccination phases.
- When you go to the sign-up sheet you can choose the location that works best for you.
- Monument Health has vaccination locations throughout the Black Hills including Spearfish.
- Our experience has shown that a small percentage of persons receiving the vaccine do experience symptoms post-vaccination that may keep them from work. You may want to consider spacing out the vaccination of teachers/faculty to avoid having a group out if they have a vaccination reaction following either a first or second dose of the vaccine.

New Feature in Respondus-Instructor Live Proctoring

HEALTH SCREENING DEADLINE - 4/1/21

Attention employees, if you have not yet completed your health screening, which is the ONLY activity required to earn your \$500 incentive this year, you have just a few days left to do that! Again, this only applies to you if you have not already had a wellness screening since 7/1/20 and have been notified by the BHR that you are still showing due. April 1 is the deadline. Employees who had not yet completed the health screening would have been notified directly by the BHR. To be eligible for the \$500 incentive, both you and your covered spouse must complete the health screening by April 1, 2021. DO YOU HAVE PLANS FOR A 2021 SUMMER INTERNSHIP? RECEIVE COLLEGE CREDIT!

Any student in the School of Business is eligible to apply for internship credit, no prerequisite required.

As a general rule, one (1) university credit hour will be earned per 50 hours of diverse work tasks. Please note that time alone does not determine credit hours awarded; rather, time, diversity of tasks, and types of tasks will be the criteria used in determining credit hours awarded. Generally, internships are three credit hours, so on average students work 10-15 hours per week. They may work more than that, but the idea of an internship is to get experience over the course of a semester, not "hurry up and get it done".

*NOTE: No more than 12 internship credits may be counted toward a major or a degree.

EAB'S NAVIGATE WILL REPLACE STARFISH THIS FALL AT BHSU

BHSU will replace Starfish this fall with Navigate, a student success management system from EAB. Northern State University is launching Navigate this fall as well, and all other BOR universities have been using it for quite some time (SDSU since 2013).

The capabilities of Navigate, in terms of communicating with students, sharing information with one another, gathering data, etc. are much better and broader than Starfish. The system will allow us to coordinate our efforts to better care for the student. Consistent use of Navigate - as well as using it to the best of its ability - will help the university meet our retention and graduation rate goals.

Professional Advisors will pilot certain functionalities this summer, and then a phased rollout to various departments across campus will begin in the fall. Most offices who will utilize Navigate have been introduced to the product, but more detailed trainings will occur as we get closer to the launch.

FINAL SPRING 2021 COURSE WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE

The last day to drop a class or withdraw from the university, for the spring 2021 semester, is <u>Tuesday</u>, April 6. Dropping a course now will result in a WD grade. If you are in jeopardy of failing a class and

will not be able to bring your grade up to passing, taking a withdraw will prevent an F from posting to your transcript. Withdraw grades are "neutral" when GPA is calculated. Meaning, it will not help or hurt your overall GPA.

You can "drop" withdraw classes through your Student Registration account. Just choose "Register for Classes," select spring 2021, and use the drop-down option next to the course, choosing "Drop-No Refund." Or, simply, e-mail johanna.best@bhsu.edu with the course information and I can drop it for you.

If you find that you are in this situation with all of your spring classes, you may want to consider withdrawing from school, for this semester. Withdrawing from the university is a good way to stop, take a breath, and jump back in during the summer or fall semester. You are welcome to return at any time. DO YOU HAVE PLANS FOR A 2021 SUMMER INTERNSHIP? RECEIVE COLLEGE CREDIT!

Any student in the School of Business is eligible to apply for internship credit, no prerequisites required.

As a general rule, one (1) university credit hour will be earned per 50 hours of diverse work tasks. Please note that time alone does not determine credit hours awarded; rather, time, diversity of tasks, and types of tasks will be the criteria used in determining credit hours awarded. Generally, internships are three credit hours, so on average students work 10-15 hours per week. They may work more than that, but the idea of an internship is to get experience over the course of a semester, not "hurry up and get it done".

*NOTE: No more than 12 internship credits may be counted toward a major or a degree.

APRIL IS SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS MONTH

April 19-24 has been designated Severe Weather Awareness Week in South Dakota. With the approach of warmer weather, it is important to remind BHSU Faculty, Staff and Students to take a moment to review our emergency procedures for severe weather.

In the event of developing weather conditions that could potentially spawn severe weather, the National Weather Service (NWS) will issue either a Severe Thunderstorm Watch or a Tornado Watch. A Watch means that atmospheric condition exist for severe weather to develop.

If the NWS upgrades a Watch to a Warning, it means that severe storm conditions exist and that you should take shelter immediately.

Severe weather advisories will be broadcast on local radio and television stations. If you hear a Severe Weather Watch has been issued for your general area, you should stay alert to weather conditions and be ready to seek shelter. If a Tornado Warning is issued Civil Defense sirens will be sounded in a non-broken continuous tone that will last up to 3-minutes in duration.

At the sounding of a Severe Weather Warning, take cover in a basement or interior room of your home or work place. If you live in a mobile home, leave at once and seek another shelter. If you are located in a public building go to a lower interior area of the building. Use stairways and avoid the use of elevators. If you are outdoors, seek shelter in a ditch or low area on the ground. Avoid positioning yourself near trees, power lines and telephone poles. If you are in a motor vehicle do not attempt to outrun the tornado. Stop, exit the vehicle immediately, and seek shelter away from your vehicle.

Tornadoes are rare in this area but can and do happen. We all need to be alert to the weather conditions, act quickly when a tornado is detected, and remain calm. You and your family should know in advance what to do if the Civil Defense warnings are issued.

State-wide Tornado Drills will be conducted on Wednesday April 21st sometime between 9 a.m. & 9:30 a.m.

To spread awareness and to signify that we support survivors of sexual assault, we encourage you to wear denim to work this Wednesday. Additionally, it would be fantastic if you'd take a pic of your denim swag and post it to our Instagram campaign (#SAAMatBHSU #30DaysofSAAM tag @NSVRC). Thank you for your leadership and for helping to spread the word.

Here's the Backstory...In 1997 in Rome, Italy, an 18-year-old girl was raped by her 45-year-old driving instructor, who was later convicted and sentenced to jail. The perpetrator appealed the sentence, and his case went to the Italian Supreme Court where the case was overturned. The Head Judge

released a statement arguing that because the victim wore tight jeans, he assumed that she must have helped her perpetrator remove her jeans and, therefore, consented. Enraged by the verdict, the women in the Italian Parliament launched into immediate action and protested by wearing jeans on the steps of the Italian Parliament building. This was the beginning of what has become a worldwide event and movement to wear jeans as a visible means of protest against misconceptions that surround sexual assault.

Greetings Colleagues!

The South Dakota Board of Regents (SDBOR) and Black Hills State University are committed to assuring equal opportunity in employment to persons with disabilities and covered veterans*. - 2. Proper personnel, to the extent appropriate, if the disability might require emergency treatment.
- 3. Government officials investigating compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act or the laws administered by the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs.

If you wish to identify yourself as a person with a disability or as a covered veteran, please complete the online forms. To self-identify, please log in to SNAP, in in the Employment Details channel select "Disability Status" and/or "Veterans Classifications" and complete the forms.

If you are a person with a disability and you wish to request an accommodation or if you have any questions regarding the self-identification please contact the human resource office.

*The term "covered veteran" includes any of the following veterans:

- i. Disabled veterans.
- ii. Veterans who served on active duty in the Armed Forces during a war or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge has been authorized.
- iii. Veterans who, while serving on active duty in the Armed Forces, participated in a United States military operation for which an Armed Forces service medal was awarded pursuant to Executive Order No. 12985 (61 Fed. Reg. 1209).
- iv. Recently separated veterans.
